# Youth in The Footsteps of Christ

Your the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. This is one of many ways that Jesus describes the bold contrast between Christians and the rest of the world. It is a difference that should be as clear as night and day, but rarely is the case with Christians in the world nowadays.

The very things that Christ warned us not to become are the exact same things - hypocritical, sheltered, and judgmental - we are viewed as today. One of the biggest reasons for the scepticism of Christianity today is the ignorance of our own faith. Christians are not getting into the world, and it shows in society. Many of us cannot answer basic questions when asked about our faith, and even if we can, many are not living out those beliefs.

Ignoring our faith has led to a religion of mixed up morals and hypocrites, and has largely contributed to the scorn towards Christianity. These views are slowly being passed down from the modern adults of today to the developing Christian youth. It is therefore paramount to look for avenues to reverse this situation and get back to inspiring hope in a culture full of cynicism.

Many people tend to think of today's youth as the leaders of tomorrow. But according to God's Word, we are to be leaders even today who earnestly desire to honour and serve our Lord in all our thoughts and actions. Apostle, Paul, told Timothy, a younger man in the faith; "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity"(1 Tim. 4:12). God specifically commands young people to be leaders - to lead by example.

As Christians, today, we must seriously consider what God's Word has to say to us. Are we measuring up to what God wants us to be? Are we just following the crowd, or do we stand

out as those who desire to be faithful and holy despite the hypocrisy and compromise of all around us on the part of both adults and other young people?

All of us are bombarded by television programmes, commercials, music, billboards, video games, magazines, newspapers and movies that give us the impression that to rebel against all authority is cool; that parents are old, out-oftouch "has been" who do not know what they are talking about; that sax, lust and immorality are perfectly acceptable as long as one is honest and responsible. How are we to respond to these pressures?

Some of our elders say, "They are just kids" or "They are only young once...let them live and enjoy all the world has to offer while they still can." But notice what the wisest man who ever lived wrote by inspiration of the Holy Spirit, in Ecclesiastes 12:1. King Solomon wrote: "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth." Notice that Solomon did not say: "Live it up while you are young, and later on you will have the opportunity to serve and glorify God." No, he said exactly the opposite. He tells young people, "Now is the time to focus on your relationship with God, the Creator of all things ever."

The attitudes of the world in which we live completely contradict the exhortations found in God's Word. Even in Gospel, 1 Timothy 4:12, Paul does not tellTimothy, "Since you are young, you have God's permission to live a wild lifestyle if you will promise to live for Him when you get older." Nor does Paul tell Timothy, "While you are young, give the older generation a reason or an excuse to point out about the way you are living and acting." On the contrary, the apostle commands Timothy to do exactly the opposite! This young man is instructed to live a blameless life and be an example to others so those who are older will not have a reason to look down on him.

In the New Testament, Paul also addressed another young man, Titus, and told him, "In all things showing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you" (Titus 2:7,8). As a young man, Titus was to be an example, a pattern, to all other believers in many areas of his life including his doctrine, his speech and his sincerity.

The Gospel gives us six areas in which we as true Christians are to be examples to other believers and unbelievers. These are; in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith and in purity. As you look carefully at each point, search your heart and ask yourself whether or not you are measuring up as a Godly example to other young people and older individuals alike. It certainly is not becoming easier to live for the Lord and maintain a consistent testimony for Christ in this evil world. But we must remember that we are called by God to be examples as true Christians; in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith and in purity.

Finally, never give up. When at times we fail the Lord in various areas of our lives, get back on track through prayer and Bible study, and keep purposing to please Him in everything you do. Keep striving to be an example of a true Christian. Jesus earnestly desires to help us, walk with us and strengthen us in every area of our lives. All we need to do is to obey Him and yield ourselves to Him and to His will. Difficult times will come - loneliness, anxiety, peer pressure and discouragement will look us straight into the eyes at times. But God is always faithful to us.

## The Secret of True Love is Loving in The Spirit

Conjugal partners cannot love one another perfectly in the "flesh" (Gal.5:19). The long and difficult path to True Love is "to love in the Spirit"! (cf. Romans 8:9; 7:14:25; 1 Jn.2:15; Gal.5:16-18, 22; Prov.4:23). Only in the realm of the Spirit will True Love bloom and grow. We have to live and walk in the Spirit (Gal.5:22; 1 Cor.12). We will attempt to point you the way.

What is the one indispensable ingredient for making marriages work? Family life educators usually answer: Communication. This is good news, because effective communication can be learned. Skills such as active listening, using "I" statements, paying attention to our feelings and those of our spouse, and learning tips for "fighting fair" make marriage thrive. Some couples use these skills intuitively, because they saw them modelled in their own upbringing. Others can learn them through classes, workshops and reading, and above all, at a Worldwide Marriage Encounter Weekend, with its life changing message, which makes good marriages great and great marriages, heavenly!

The world teaches us that love is something one feels. If love is just warm fuzzy emotions, how will it enrich marriage? The New Testament and Holy Mother the Church teach us that, true love is sacrificial. The primary expression of love is not embracing feelings of affection or being on Cloud 9; it is accepting the rough wood of the Cross.

The fact is that love is not limited to feelings and emotions. God gives us emotions so often tied to love, to remind us of the joy which love brings about. Very often, though, we find that love is difficult. Indeed, very often "True Love" is elusive. Love is a choice. One has to make "to love a decision". To learn about love, to study in the school of love, is to meditate on the Cross of Christ. We urge you: look to the Cross. Be sure to hang a Crucifix in your home that, you may constantly at the most perfect image of True Love: This is a blend of information, knowledge, and a mature twosome, powered by the Holy Spirit. It does not come by easily in the sunshine years, but in the endless joy-through-pain, twilight period of a marriage.

We need to prayerfully strive to sit at the foot of the Cross in marriage. Sometimes we feel the emotions of love, but not always. When good feelings fade, when we've had a sleepless night because our child was restless and cranky, we should draw consolation from the Cross. When we needlessly keep away from 'marital embrace', because we are hurt with one another, the Cross can inspire us to forgive and reconcile. When the nuptial act brings new life into the world, we must, in gratitude, go to the Cross.

The Cross is the fountainhead of True Love, which is a total gift of one's self to our Vowed Lover. It is not experiencing butterflies in our stomach; neither is it a pounding heart, nor emotions of romance. True Love is trudging up Mount Calvary. True Love bleeds. True Love gasps for breath as it hangs from the Cross due to unruly children, everyday misgivings, or financial distress. True Love is a sacrificial gift we make to our spouse and our God. Therefore, we must all strive, and work hard, to make our lives conform to the Cross of Christ. Marriage does not offer us happiness which is ephemeral; we are called to fidelity: Joy in pain!

We often remind ourselves that marriage is a covenant like those of the Old Testament, which was 'cut in the blood' of animals, where both partners, had to symbolically die, if a pact was to be arrived at. Jesus himself died as he sealed the 'new and eternal covenant' in his blood, so must conjugal partners, who make Vows to one another in the Sacrament of marriage. It is worth reinforcing that every marriage is validated at the foot of Christ's Cross and Resurrected as Jesus did on Easter Sunday.

#### A Love Letter to My Beloved

In marriage, each partner has his/her own unique love story that God continues to write, over a lifetime - a story that is exquisite, a narrative that has God's love and mercy woven through it. As God continues to pen our story, it is good to reflect on where He has brought us to, and what He has brought us through. We thought we'd share with you a sample "Love Letter" from one Christian spouse to another. The art of writing a good old-fashioned "Love Letter" may has faded, but the spirit of writing one should still be very much alive in our hearts and lived in our lives. Dialogue or the 10/10 of Marriage Encounter is the charism of the Marriage Enrichment Movement, with 'attentive listening with the heart' by both partners, as the key ingredient.

#### My Dearly Beloved....

I am writing this letter as a token of my love for you, as a keepsake for you to treasure, and as a reminder of my commitment to us and to our life together. I want you to know that I love you, 'All of You', and I always will. I am committed to our marriage until death do us part. At times, in moments of deep frustration, I may have questioned otherwise, but that was my immature way of seeking love from you when I should have turned to the Spirit for help, not you, to fill the void in my temporarily wandering heart. Beloved, I know I have hurt you countless times with my words and actions and for all them - I sincerely and humbly ask for your forgiveness. Since God made my heart to fit yours in the Sacrament of Marriage, I pine for you even when my heart is broken, even when I feel deeply hurt by your actions, or lack thereof, that my heart feels frozen - I still long for you. I have pondered this many times over, and have come to realize that this is what God truly desires - this longing. It keeps bringing me back to my knees in prayer to pray for us.

Sometimes I feel our love for one another gets buried amidst the daily stress of life. Thank you for all of the sacrifices you have made and continue to make for us. I am always reminded when I see you working so hard that, 'sacrifice' means "to make holy." In fact, in a mystical way, it is deeply attractive because I see Christ working through you, in a powerful way as you serve our marriage and family.

## Valentine's Day

Who can resist romance? Well, few people can and unsurprisingly that, while we have various days devoted to Mothers, Fathers, Daughters, Elderly etc, we also have a day celebrating love and romance. This is not the love between a mother and child for instance or between two platonic friends. It is a day celebrating romantic love with a capital L.

Corinthians 13- Love is patient, love is kind, it does not envy, it does not boast. It is not proud. It does not dishonour others. It is not self- seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs.

John- Anyone who does not love does not know God because God is love. Valentine's Day gets its name from a popular saint named Valentine who was a Priest from Rome in the third century. He served as a Bishop of Terni, Marnia and Amelia. He was placed on house arrest with Judge Asterius.

Valentine pledged his love for Jesus to a doubtful Judge Asterius. Immediately, the Judge put Valentine and his faith to the test. Valentine was presented with the Judge Asterius' blind daughter and told to restore her sight. If he was successful, the Judge would do anything for him in return. Placing his hands on the girl's eyes, Valentine was able to restore back her vision. Judge Asterius was humbled and obeyed Valentine's requests. He broke all their idols in his home, fasted for three days and was baptised along with his family and a household of 44 members. Judge Asterius then freed all the Christian inmates.

However, later on, Valentine was arrested again for continuing to convert people into Christianity.

It is said that besides his attempt to convert people, he also angered the authorities because he secretly performed marriages of Christian couples and aided Christians being persecuted by Emperor Claudius in Rome. Both acts were considered to be very serious.

A relationship between the Emperor Claudius and Valentine began to grow a bit favourably. However, Emperor Claudius became enraged when Valentine attempted to convince Claudius of Christianity. He was then sentenced to death. He was commanded to renounce his faith or be beaten with clubs and then beheaded. But Valentine refused to do so and thus laid down his life in martrydom for Christ.

On the day of his execution according to history, he left Judge Asterius' daughter a note, signed, "Your Valentine." This of course, captured the hearts of many and thus this phrase is still used till date.

There is absolutely no doubt that St. Valentine really did exist because archaeologists have unearthed a Roman catacomb and an ancient church dedicated to St Valentine.

In 496 Pope, Gelasius marked February 14th as a celebration in honour of his martyrdom. Relics are found all over the world. Father John Spratt received a gift from Pope in 1836 containing a small vessel tinged with St Valentine's blood. This gift stands in Whitefriar Church in Dublin, Ireland.

Today, St Valentine is not just a patron Saint of lovers but also of beekeepers, epilepsy, happy marriages, plague, travellers and young people. He is generally represented very romantically in pictures with birds and roses.

St. Valentine said, "Your flaws are perfect for the heart that is meant to love you." He also said,

"There is only one happiness in this life, to love and to be loved."

Valentine's Day should be celebrated with the spirit of love and thanksgiving for the love we experience in our lives.

It's often a sort of competition, where teams of Programmers, Developers, Designers and Project Managers come together to design & build a nice product, a software project or a hardware project.

As a pre-requisite for Smart India Hackathon (SIH) - 2020, internal Hackathon has to be conducted in the Institute to shortlist participating teams. In collaboration with IIC, ACM Chapter and Industry Association, we conducted an Internal Hackathon on 17th and 18th January,

2020.
