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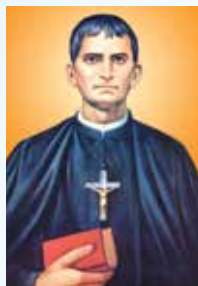

From time immemorial mankind has been looking for a solution of a problem that has hounded it from the beginning - the awareness of our limitedness and the aspiration for fullness or eternity. This quest has yielded thousands of explanations and attempts that are visible in the Egyptian Pyramids, the majestic Mausoleums that witness to the aspirations of the humanity to live beyond its short passage on this earth.

On the other hand humanity has also invented a process which is also called civilization that has from the beginning of history, made endless attempts to ensure that our existence on this planet becomes effortless and as lasting as possible. Civilization's most powerful tool has been the harnessing of energy required to move, change and transform

everything that is thought to be desirable to make our life on this planet more comfortable and under our control. Islands have been created in the sea, space stations set up thousands of miles up in

Christmas: Celebration of God's Love

“Our interior life becomes caught up in its own interests and concerns, there is no longer room for others, no place for poor. God’s voice is no longer heard, quite joy of his love is no longer felt and the desire to do good fades.” These are the words of Pope Francis from his Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* (EG 2) which rightly uncovers the circumstances in which we are living today because human hearts are worried and feeling weary and struggling to rise up from the ill effects of Covid-19. Protecting oneself is the highest goal of people today and as we are at the verge of the new variant omicron shows once again that the pandemic is far from over and we may expect strict norms are re-imposed once again but Jesus in the manger shows us the way of tenderness to be close to each other, to be human. Christmas invites us to celebrate the presence of our Jesus, Emmanuel who never kept himself away, being unaffected by our sinfulness but bore our sins. Hence, it is our time to be with our neighbours expressing our tenderness and love.

Paradise to Manger

“Love caused your incarnation; love brought you down to me. Your thirst for my salvation procured my liberty. Oh, love beyond all telling that led you to embrace in love, all love excelling, our lost and fallen race!”. This is the hymn by Paul Gerhardt which unveils the true meaning of Christmas celebration that it is love that caused incarnation and it is love that moved God from paradise to manger. By his incarnation, the Son of God tells us that salvation comes through love, acceptance, respect for this poor humanity of ours which we all share in a great variety of races, languages and cultures. Yes! Incarnation is the sign of God’s love for the whole created world. All that God has created is included in the Christmas celebration. It is vividly presented by St. Athanasius saying, “For He was made man that we might be made God; and He manifested Himself by a body that we might receive the idea of the unseen Father; and He endured the insolence of men/women that we might inherit

immortality.” Hence, Christmas as the celebration of love represents an appropriate recognition that humans are God’s image-bearers. So, Jesus is the precious gift of God the Father in which He expressed his love for humanity.

Manger to Cross

Speaking of incarnation, in his book ‘Mystery and Destiny of the Human Person’ Fr. Sebastian Athappilly expressed,

“We speak of incarnation of the word in Law and Prophets, incarnation of God’s action in history of the people of Israel, incarnation of his presence in the midst of the people localized in the Ark, the Tent and the Temple. God adopted all the ways by which human persons communicate with one another. He spoke, acted and was present. The movement of incarnation has reached its climax in Jesus Christ, who is himself the whole incarnation.”

Incarnation is a dynamic process which is finally fully expressed in Jesus Christ. Subsequently, the expression of God’s love that is manifested in and through Jesus is dynamic in nature because we notice the progressive development of God’s works of love in the life of Jesus from the manger to the cross. Jesus taught the essential nature and spirit of love when he comprised the Ten Commandments of the Old Testament to just two: love God and love your neighbor as yourself (Lk 10:27). We see the horizontal and vertical love of Jesus for us in his public ministry. And if we put them together, we get the cross and it is on the cross the love of God is manifested fully which is revealed in the birth of Jesus Christ in the manger at Bethlehem. And, whenever God wants to assure humanity of His Love He always points to the cross, it was there that God’s love was manifested for us. So, Christmas as the celebration of God’s love for humanity and for creation at large picturizes before our eyes Jesus’ life as we stand before the manger on this Christmas day.

To conclude, in the words of Pope Benedict XVI, “In that child, God’s Love becomes manifest:

The Difference Between Efficiency And Effectiveness

Efficiency and effectiveness are both commonly used management terms. Yet, while they sound similar and start with the same letters, they both mean different things. According to the famed management guru, Peter Drucker: “Efficiency is doing things right. Effectiveness is doing the right things”.

Efficiency refers to doing things in a right manner. Scientifically, it is defined as the output to input ratio and focuses on getting the maximum output with minimum resources. Effectiveness, on the other hand, refers to doing the right things. It constantly measures if the actual output meets the desired output. Since efficiency is all about focusing on the process, importance is given to the ‘means’ of doing things whereas effectiveness focuses on achieving the ‘end’ goal.

Efficiency is concerned with the present state or the ‘status quo’. Thinking about the future and adding or eliminating any resources might disturb the current state of efficiency. Effectiveness, on the other hand, believes in meeting the end goal and therefore takes into consideration any variables that may change in the future.

In order to be efficient, time and again discipline and rigor is required. This can build inflexibility into the system. Effectiveness, on the other hand, keeps the long term strategy in mind and is thus more adaptable to the changing environment.

Since efficiency is about doing things right, it demands documentation and repetition of the same steps. Doing the same thing again and again in the same manner will certainly discourage innovation. On the other hand, effectiveness encourages innovation as it demands people to think, the different ways they can meet the desired goal. Efficiency will look at avoiding mistakes or errors

whereas effectiveness is about gaining success.

If business owners were to ask themselves whether efficiency or effectiveness is more important, the answer should be effectiveness. This is how goals (and ultimately profits) are measured. When efficiency is of itself seen as a goal, the company’s results and profit will suffer in the long term.

Technology is a wonderful thing. It can automate tasks that are mundane and boring; it allows more efficient communication. However, when it’s not measured against your company’s goals, no one is asking and answering the important question “Is all of this efficiency contributing to our effectiveness?”

In the days of mass production, efficiency was the most important performance indicator for any organization. However, now with consumers facing an increasing number of choices, effectiveness of an organization is always questioned. In order to be a successful organization, there needs to be a balance between effectiveness and efficiency. Only being efficient and not meeting the requirements of the stakeholders of the organization is of little use.

How do I balance efficiency and effectiveness in my business? Entrepreneurs need to question the purpose of the business. Why does the business exist? Is my business doing the right things? Am I strategically working in the right areas? Efficiency needs to be tempered with effectiveness to organically grow the business. When a small business owner loses sight of the purpose of the organization, efficiency takes over as the predominant theme. Efficiency alone produces less than with effectiveness combined. Efficiency needs to work in harmony with effectiveness- form and function. The lesson from here is that we can also use the same strategy, albeit with certain modifications, to successfully manage our personal lives too!

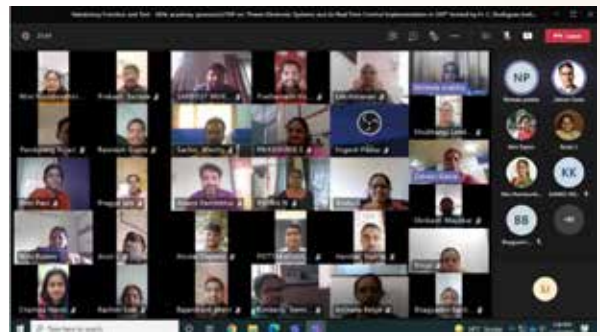
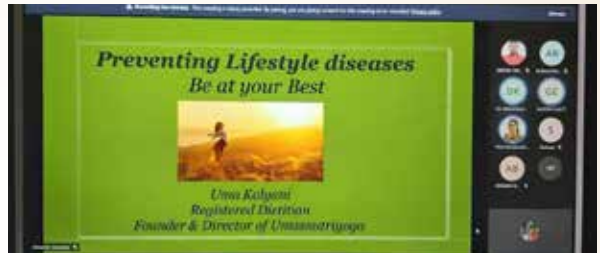
AICTE-ATAL Academy Sponsored FDP by Electrical Department

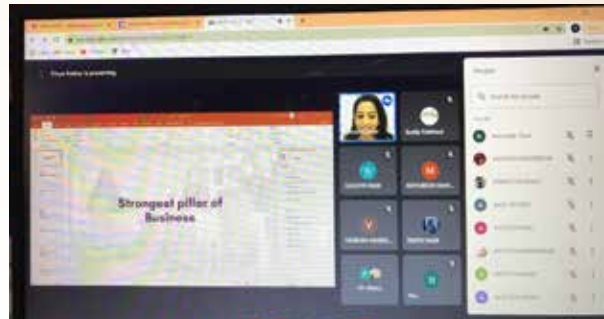
India Startup Day

presentation by the Director Mr. Deepak Shah and a tour of the campus facilities at IMS, followed by lunch.



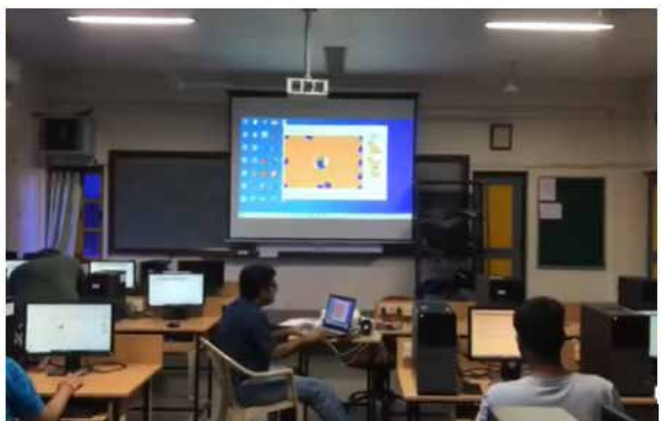
This year marks the silver jubilee for IMS and Padre Conceicao College of Engineering as well.
